UNLOCKING WORK IN METRO DENVER: IMPACTS OF IMPROVING ACCESS TO AFFORDABLE CHILD CARE

Finding available and affordable child care is a pressing concern for many Colorado families.

STATEWIDE IMPACTS

- Many parents choose to care for their children full time, however 1/5th of all mothers with kids under 6, return to the workforce after their child reaches school age.
- 17% of mothers with younger children who are out of the labor force but would prefer to be working cite child care as the main issue, impacting the state economy by \$3.8 billion.
- There are 2 licensed child care slots for every 3 children under 6 whose parents are in the labor force, creating a deficit of 88,500 slots.

Rather than creating additional government and public funding streams, it is important to educate leaders on 25 recent state bills, including many for local governments to improve the financial sustainability of the child care business model. As an example, just 3 of the initially projected 56 child care centers have taken advantage of the enhanced property tax exemption granted under HB22-1006. Local government can now declare child care a local need and enhance existing targeted state tax credits.
